SHARE JESUS MISSION

As we prepare for our Easter Mission, let's be encouraged by this report of similar missions by Paula & Rowland Lines.

Spending ten days on mission with people you've never met before but who share similar love for Jesus can result in an incredible bond of fellowship. We learn to accept each other's limitations and weaknesses, and to pray for healing of personality problems. If everyone had to wait until they were perfect before going to the frontline of witness - there would be no witnesses!

Rowland led a team to a church of 30, mainly elderly members, in a run-down part of Stoke on Trent The church people were very supportive, and had prepared well. The church hall was in a poor state of disrepair, being frequently vandalised. The kitchen was OK but the toilets were outside. The hall is used for various community organisations. Their task was to witness to them bringing folk into the life of the church. So they spoke to people not usually associated with the church — at youth clubs and assemblies, at a disco, at old people's lunches and homes. They joined them at bingo and sequence dancing classes!

They found a greater hunger for the Gospel than Rowland had seen elsewhere. People gave their lives to Christ. The team bought Bibles for some who had none. They left praising God for new Christians and a church with new zeal.

Paula was Pastor to a Team in Crewe 10 miles from Rowland. She was helped by an assistant she already knew. Their mission was primarily to church members and adherents. They visited homes, started a mums and toddler club, visited clubs for youth, senior citizens and disabled. They started house groups and motivated Sunday school teachers to undertake training. The faith of church members was stimulated, encouraging them to re-commitment and regular Bible study.

It is vital that we all prepare for our Mission by Prayer. Come to Springboard - dates on page 7 - and share in our planning. Fuller details in next Newsletter.

CHURCH BENEVOLENT FUND

In the last Newsletter mention was made of the various charities our Church supports. The Church Council has decided that instead of taking up a second collection during each Communion Service, a retiring collection (a plate left at the door) will be taken at both services once a month. The collections will be linked to the church calendar, and will usually be taken on the 3rd Sunday of the month. This will often co-incide with the monthly morning communion. Sometimes envelopes may be available during the month for those not at church that particular Sunday. Informational inserts will be included in this newsletter when available.

Four of the collections each year will be for the local Church Benevolent Fund. By tradition this is used to buy Communion Wine, to send Christmas Cards to our pensioners and Easter Cards to housebound friends. Small gifts may be made ancrymously from this fund by the minister to friends in particularly difficult circumstances. Any balance at the end of the year goes to "top up" other charities.

The following table shows the new pattern. Those in brackets indicate that house-to-house collections or "flag days" are arranged by our church friends.

Other urgent appeals will naturally invite a high priority.

The appeal is accompanied by the offer of free videos on Romania and Russia. No - I am not appealing for your money - but invite you to examine the appeals I'm placing on the crush hall notice board. "His feith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did." James 2:22 (NIV)

James here refers to Abraham who folded his tent, packed his belongings, loaded his camel, and with his tribe, headed West. 1500 miles later in his new homeland he recognized that God had fulfilled all that he had promised. Abraham's faith and actions worked together.

We read of others in Scripture and elsewhere who also proved their faith by their actions. Jeremiah, goaled by the King for forecasting that he and his countrymen would be force-marched to Babylon was visited by his cousin who sold him a piece of land. Imagine buying land when you expect to become a refugee! Money thrown away? Jeremiah records in his diary "Houses, field and vinyards will again be bought in this land." In our lingo — "We'll be back!" Jeremiah's faith and actions were in harness.

The Roman Centurian in Luke 7 was highly commended to Jesus by the local Jewish big-wigs. His message to Jesus was "Sir, there's no need for you to travel to my home to heal my seriously ill servant. Just speak the healing word and he'll become well." Such faith!

Noting such positive affirmations of faith in God and his Son Jesus our Seviour, what must we do to prove our faith? We should show our confidence in the future of Christ's church here in Rosyth by:

- (a) Worshipping regularly. A former President of Methodist Conference said "Worship is the Christian community's celebration of its faith in a living God and a Christ who is living Lord of his world."
- (b) Offering more of our wealth, time and abilities to God as part of our response in worship. By giving more, we re-act as Jeremiah did to the demands of his faith.
- (c) Being neighbourly in the fullest, world-wide sense following Jesus' words "Inasmuch as you do it to the least, you do it for me."

Let our faith and action be seen working together.
